




Monday, April 22nd is Earth Day and to start the celebrations we're hosting another CicLAvia this weekend! This time, we are closing down Venice Boulevard from National all the way to Venice Beach. If you've never been to CicLAvia, it's a day-long celebration that will transform Venice Boulevard into a car-free zone, bringing neighbors together, supporting local businesses, and promoting sustainable transportation.

Los Angeles is moving towards a future that supports clean and safe transportation options. My team and I have been working to realize this shift in the Fifth District, launching the first 24-hour bus lane outside of Downtown LA and a protected bike

lane along Venice Boulevard just last year. These projects are crucial for making our streets safer and our commutes more sustainable.

CicLAvia is a great opportunity to experience these changes first-hand. By closing the street to cars, we open it up for people. Whether you're cycling, walking, or skating, you're participating in a vision of Los Angeles that prioritizes public spaces and community health over car traffic.

My team and I will be stationed at the Palms Hub. I hope you'll stop by and share your thoughts on how we can further improve our city.

UPDATES ON OUR PROGRESS

#### **Housing Operation on Wilshire Boulevard**

In a collaborative effort between the City, the Los Angeles Homelessness Services Authority, and my office, we successfully relocated 27 individuals from tent encampments on Wilshire Boulevard to temporary housing facilities. This operation not only cleared the tents but also ensured that these individuals are now able to receive necessary services, and eventually move into permanent housing.

#### **Operation Sparkle**

This past weekend, my team and I joined forces with the Miracle Mile Residential Association, Mid City West Neighborhood Council, and The Mirabel for Operation Sparkle—a community clean-up along Wilshire Boulevard. #### LAPD Catalytic Converter Etching and Car Seat Installation Event

I also stopped by a catalytic converter etching event hosted by the LAPD West LA division. Putting your VIN or license plate number on your catalytic converter can help prevent theft, and makes it easier for honest scrap dealers to spot stolen items and help return them to their rightful owners.





#### **Interfaith Passover Seder**

This Tuesday, my team and I joined a beautiful interfaith seder hosted by the Jewish Federation at the Museum of Tolerance. It was an honor to share this time with leaders like Rabbi Sharon Hronsky and Pastor James K. McKnight. We listened to stories of the Exodus and enjoyed beautiful music performed by the choirs from Temple Isaiah and FAME Church.



#### **Ride Along with LAPD Wilshire Division**

I spent Wednesday evening on a ride along with Sergeant Sarno from the LAPD Wilshire Division to see and hear firsthand from our first responders what is happening in our community. We discussed pressing issues like homelessness and how to make our communities safer. I'm looking forward to strengthening our relationship even further, and finding new ways to support our first responders and their critical work.



#### **Recreation and Parks report on Golf Tee-Time Reservation System**

I put forward a motion this week with Councilwoman Raman asking the Department of Recreation and Parks to report on how they manage their golf tee-time reservation system. There have been reports in recent weeks that the current system encourages black-market brokers to book and resell tee times for profit. These bad actors shouldn't abuse our public services, and we are working with Recreation and Parks to stop them.

#### **Aluminate LA Presentation**

In Council this week as part of our Earth Day celebrations, we recognized the City's Olivia Mitchell Youth Council Youth, which just won a \$10K micro-grant from the LA Chargers and Ball Corporation for their project, Aluminate LA. The project promotes sustainability by encouraging aluminum recycling. The Youth Council has been hard at work on the project since last Fall, and I am immensely proud of them for their commitment to improving our environment.



#### **Comprehensive Plastics Reductions Program**

The City seeks to implement a citywide Comprehensive Plastics Reduction Program, which would involve adopting measures to reduce or eliminate the production and use of single-use plastic products and encourage reuse of other items. The Program would reduce or eliminate single-use plastics from the City's waste stream and the environment and reducing the aesthetic, environmental, and human health impacts of single-use plastics. The City is currently accepting comment on the proposed <u>Comprehensive Plastics Reduction Program and its Draft Program EIR.</u> The comment period is open through 5:00 p.m. on Friday April 26, 2024. How it works:

1) Visit <u>www.pesachpickup.com</u> by Sunday evening, April 21st, to check if your home address is on one of the two collection maps. If it is, you are all set! LA Sanitation

trucks will come by to pick up all containers that are set out at the curb or alleyway in these areas. If your address is NOT in one of the two areas, use the Other Areas form on the website to schedule your pickup. Those addresses NOT in the areas shown will receive an email confirmation upon scheduling.

2) On Monday morning, April 22nd, the day before Passover, have your containers set out at the curb or alleyway BEFORE 6:00 AM.
